Re: Proposed Melville Pit

The purpose of this letter is to advise of the serious concerns and reservations the Town of Orangeville has with respect to the proposed 300 acre gravel pit located 1 km south of Orangeville referred to as the Melville Pit.

At its meeting on August 12, CAMP (Citizens Against the Melville Pit) made a presentation to Orangeville Council outlining their concerns to the proposed Melville Pit. Orangeville Council shares these concerns. This proposed gravel pit may present real and serious threats to Orangeville's core values – outdoor lifestyle, tourism and green community, and have major ramifications to Orangeville's water, air quality, truck traffic and property values.

Orangeville Council has directed staff to prepare an information report with respect to the proposed gravel pit to be brought back to Orangeville Council for its consideration.

We would request that the Town of Orangeville's concerns be noted and that the Town of Orangeville be added to the notification list for all matters relating to this proposed gravel pit.
